Modern Movies that highlight the LGBTQ+ Community (Movie Night)

Summerland (2020): A period drama about a reclusive writer in World War II England who forms an unexpected bond with a young evacuee, touching on themes of love and acceptance. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

Brokeback Mountain (2005): A groundbreaking love story between two cowboys in the American West who struggle to reconcile their feelings amidst societal expectations. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

Call Me by Your Name (2017): Set in Italy during the 1980s, it's a poignant tale of a young man's awakening to love and desire during a transformative summer. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

The Danish Girl (2015): Based on the true story of transgender pioneer Lili Elbe, it explores her journey of self-discovery and the complexities of identity. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

The Imitation Game (2014): A biographical drama about mathematician Alan Turing, who played a crucial role in breaking German codes during World War II while grappling with his homosexuality. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

Carol (2015): Set in the 1950s, it's a love story between an aspiring photographer and an older woman going through a divorce, highlighting societal pressures and personal desires. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

Tell It to the Bees (2018): A romance drama set in 1950s Scotland, where a doctor and a young mother's relationship challenges societal norms and prejudices. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

Ammonite (2020): A romantic drama set in the 1840s, following the passionate and transformative relationship between acclaimed paleontologist Mary Anning and a married woman, Charlotte Murchison. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

Portrait of a Lady on Fire (2019): Set in 18th-century France, it's a poignant love story between an artist and her subject, exploring themes of desire, freedom, and the complexities of love in a restrictive society. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

Cowboys (2021): A heartfelt drama about a father and son on the run in the Montana wilderness, navigating family dynamics, gender identity, and the challenges of acceptance in a conservative environment. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

Documentaries that highlight the LGBTQ+ Community

Not Another Second (2019): tells the untold stories of 12 LGBTQ+ elders and explores the years they lost due to societal constraints. <u>Watch Trailer</u> | <u>Full Documentary</u>

A Secret Love (2020): A documentary following the enduring relationship of a same-sex couple who kept their love hidden for decades, exploring themes of love, commitment, and LGBTQ history. <u>Watch</u> <u>Trailer</u>

PRIDE (2021): an American documentary television miniseries revolving around LGBTQ rights in the United States decade-by-decade. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

Before Stonewall (1984): Explores LGBTQ history and activism before the Stonewall riots, providing a historical perspective on the LGBTQ rights movement. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

The Times of Harvey Milk (1984): A documentary about Harvey Milk, one of the first openly gay elected officials in the United States, and his impact on LGBTQ rights. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

Paris is Burning (1990): Offers a glimpse into the drag ball culture of the late 1980s in New York City and the lives of LGBTQ individuals within that community. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

For the Bible Tells Me So (2007): Examines the intersection of religion and LGBTQ identity, featuring personal stories of LGBTQ individuals and their families. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

The Celluloid Closet (1995): Explores LGBTQ representation in Hollywood films throughout history, shedding light on stereotypes and challenges faced by LGBTQ characters. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

How to Survive a Plague (2012): Chronicles the early years of the AIDS epidemic and the activism of LGBTQ individuals and allies in response to the crisis. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

The Death and Life of Marsha P. Johnson (2017): Investigates the life and legacy of Marsha P. Johnson, a prominent figure in the LGBTQ rights movement and the Stonewall uprising. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

Becoming Chaz (2011): Follows the transition of Chaz Bono, son of Cher and Sonny Bono, and explores themes of gender identity and acceptance. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

We Were Here (2011): Documents the impact of the AIDS epidemic on the LGBTQ community in San Francisco during the 1980s and 1990s. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

Edie & Thea: A Very Long Engagement (2009): Tells the love story of a lesbian couple who were together for over four decades, highlighting themes of commitment and resilience. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

Modern TV Shows & Series that highlight the LGBTQ+ Community

"Schitt's Creek" (2015-2020): A comedy series about a wealthy family who loses their fortune and must live in a small town they once bought as a joke, featuring LGBTQ characters and themes of acceptance and love. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

"A League of Their Own" (2022): A reimagining of the 1992 film, following the lives of the women in the All-American Girls Professional Baseball League and their journey to overcome societal barriers while pursuing their love for baseball during World War II. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

"Modern Family" (2009-2020): Follows the lives of an extended family, including a gay couple raising their daughter, showcasing diverse family dynamics and relationships. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

"Grace and Frankie" (2015-present): A comedy about two women who become unlikely friends after their husbands reveal they are gay and in love with each other, navigating life and relationships in their later years. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

"Pose" (2018-2021): Set in the late 1980s and early 1990s, it explores the ball culture scene in New York City and the lives of LGBTQ individuals, particularly transgender women of color. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

"Modern Love" (2019-present): An anthology series exploring various love stories, including LGBTQ relationships, with each episode based on true stories published in The New York Times column. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

"Transparent" (2014-2019): Follows a Los Angeles family as they navigate personal and family issues, including the patriarch's transition from male to female. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

"Gentleman Jack" (2019-present): Based on the life of Anne Lister, a 19th-century landowner and lesbian, it follows her relationships and challenges in a conservative society. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

"One Day at a Time" (2017-2019, 2021): A sitcom about a Cuban-American family dealing with everyday life, including LGBTQ themes through the character Elena's journey of self-discovery and coming out. <u>Watch Trailer</u>

"RuPaul's Drag Race" (2009-present): A reality competition series featuring drag queens competing in various challenges, celebrating drag culture and LGBTQ expression.
