Chef Locanto will be reprising Goldstein's Apple Cider Honey Cake for the upcoming Hanukkah feast at THC as well.

Chef Laconto said that Goldstein often stops by to share traditional Jewish recipes for holidays. Laconto enjoys making these treats, "Yvonne brings her iPad or her recipe box and has me take pictures of them."
